3.1 Police report.

PCSO Smith couldn't attend but PC Recchia and PCSO Fee attended on her behalf PC Recchia said that the most of the children and their parents involved in throwing the tarmac in to the garden in Pallett Hill from the cemetery have been spoken to. 3.2 North Yorkshire Council

Cllr Les – North Yorkshire Council have to produce a Local Plan within 5 years. Within the next year there will be a call for sites for development. Any land can be put forward for development but it will not necessarily be accepted for development. MOTTO have now put in 2 separate planning applications for development of the lorry park at Barton for lorries only and the rest area at Scotch Corner for cars and coaches. Road Chef have still not come back to NYC with a proposal for the use of the s106 money to develop an offsite area to mitigate the disturbance of the wildlife and ecology at the proposed Motorway Service site at junction 52. Until they do this the plans cannot be brought back before the planning committee.

5. Matters arising.

David Fryer has contacted the clerk to say that a neighbour that attends Northallerton's, Men's without Sheds group has offered to donate a bench they are repairing to replace the broken one at the Brough Meadows, Swale Lane corner (Mentioned last month).

The Councillors thanked the group for this. The Clerk suggested that they should give a donation to them. £50 was agreed on.

Cllr Ryan asked if there had been any response to the advert for co-option of another Parish Councillor – The Clerk said that she has had no response.

The Clerk has received the results of the Village in Bloom competition. Unfortunately, the Village didn't win. Moulton were 1st, Bellerby 2nd and Scorton 3rd.

6. Current Issues.

6.1 Playpark Annual Inspection Report.

The Annual inspection was carried out at the beginning of September. A number of issues were raised.

The fence in King's Close Play Park between the play area and Mowbray Road is in a very poor state of repair and is broken in places. Cllr Campbell has asked Colin to take a look. He said it would cost £700. It needs doing before it gets any worse. Proposed Cllr Ryan, Seconded Cllr Bhatti.

A number of the wooden posts have strimming damage marks on. Cllr Campbell will mention this to Colin.

In Arena View play park, the trees are over hanging the swings. Cllr Campbell has asked Colin to trim these back.

6.2 Pay Phone Removal Consultation.

The Clerk has been contacted by NYC to make sure that the Parish Council is aware of the potential removal of payphones by British Telecom from certain villages including Catterick. A 90-day removal notice has been put in the effected phone boxes.

NYC want to know the thoughts of the Parish Council.

The Council was initially contacted by B.T in 2019. At this time the Council agreed on the removal of the box.

Data from B.T shows there is good mobile phone coverage in the village and that the phone has only be used 8 times over the last 12 months.

The Councillors once again agreed that the pay phone could be removed and that they did not want the opportunity to buy the box for £1.

The Clerk will complete the survey.

7. Parish Finance

7.1 The periodic accounts.

Cllr Ryan asked what was happening about the parades on Remembrance Sunday. The Rev Lindsay has contacted the Clerk and said that she has been in touch with Marne Barracks but they are unable to help and that the regiment would prefer a service at church followed by the wreath laying at Low Green only. The public would have to stay on the footpaths as there would be no road closures.
